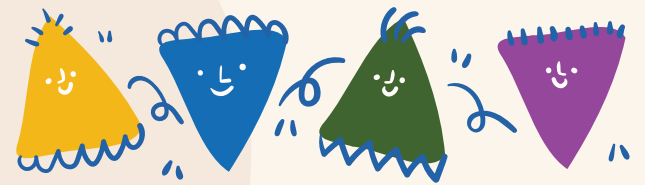

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# OUR VISION

Craftsmanship and sustainability meet innovation.

The Circular Embroidery Project connects partners from Germany, Greece, and Italy to preserve hand-embroidery skills while giving them new purpose in the circular economy.

By transforming unused garments into creative textile pieces, we build skills, confidence, and community.



# TRAINING FOR FUTURE TRAINERS

The project offers intensive training courses hosted by Fabric Republic (Athens).

Experienced German tutors introduce embroidery techniques through hands-on sessions supported by digital learning modules.

Each partner sends two future trainers, who will later share their new expertise within their own communities.

During three days of practice and mentoring, participants explore materials, fabrics, and creative approaches – ending with a one-stop shop event presenting their work.

## LOCAL WORKSHOPS & PILOT ACTIVITIES

Germany  
Adds online-selling skills – how to present and market handcrafted products.

Greece  
Integrates internationalisation – taking local products beyond national borders.

Italy  
Supports entrepreneurship – turning creativity into income through micro-businesses.

Each pilot involves at least two trainers per country and five intensive days of collaborative work.
